Year 8 Graduation Residential Students' Code of Conduct

- I will know where a member of staff is at all times and how to contact them.
- I will ensure that staff know where I am at all times.
- I will follow ALL rules and instructions given by staff and camp instructors.
- I will be aware of emergency procedures/escape routes of any buildings where activities take place.
- I recognise that I am an ambassador for Outwood Academy Bydales.
- I will respect the authority of all teachers and Carlton staff.

Year 8 Graduation Residential Students' Code of Conduct continued

- I will respect my fellow students and their belongings.
- I will be quiet and in my own room by 21.30.
- I will not bring banned items.
- I will not smoke or bring cigarettes with me.
- I will not go off on my own or attempt to leave the camp.
- I will alert a member of staff if someone is missing or in difficulties.
- I will alert a member of staff if I have any concerns or worries.

I understand and accept the above standards of behaviour and accept that failure to abide by these regulations will result in:

1. Verbal warning
2. Exclusion from activity.
3. Immediate notification to the Principal and parents.
4. Parents to collect me from Carlton Lodge Centre immediately.

Expectations and Mobile Phones

Medical Information

Medicine should be clearly labelled with student name and any dosage information etc in a ziploc bag.

- Toiletries
